► The Coast and Clay Trail

This is the most challenging of the eight trails, although there are easy sections to the north and south of St Austell, including the popular off road Pentewan Trail. However, your efforts will be rewarded! The route provides a contrast of landscapes: rolling farmland; wooded creeks; sheltered coves; colourful fishing villages; historic towns; and views of the unique lunar landscape of the china clay industry. Take your time, spend a few days on the trail and visit some of the fantastic attractions en-route. It's worth the effort!

Accessible from the Coast and Clay Trail are the Clay Trails north of St Austell (see separate map in this series).
